Dear Metro Tacoma Fencing Club Families and Friends,

Fencing season 2023-2024 update

The 2023-2024 fencing season started August first. Welcome to our new fencers and their families! We are excited having you join a wonderful sport. Metro Tacoma Fencing Club has already had 32 fencers compete in 80 events locally, regionally, and internationally. We are off to a great start! There are a number of local, regional, and national events coming up and scheduled throughout the season. The October North American Cup (NAC)

is the next national-level event which will be held 10/26 - 10/29 in Orlando, Florida. A number of our fencers are training hard for this competition.

Coach Chung competed this weekend at the World Veteran (50 years old and older) Fencing Championships held this year at Daytona Beach, Florida representing Team South Korea. He went against the very best male foil fencers ages 50-59 years-old and finished 22nd place.

Cristian, who is a member of our elite foil group, had an amazing season in 2023-2024 having even competed at the Cadet and Junior World Championships. He is currently ranked 140th in the world for Junior (Under 20 years old) men's foil so will be competing at the upcoming World Cup in Peru next month. Best of luck!

Metro Tacoma Fencing Club end of season 2022-2023 achievements

We held our annual social gathering on August 19 where we got to hang out and enjoy each other's company. We were honoring the memory of our late friend, Tom Priester, who was part of our club for years, a fencer, a volunteer coach, and a generous benefactor. If you are interested in reviving the social scene at Metro Tacoma Fencing Club, please let us know! COVID-19 put a damper on a lot of the things we used to do.

Last season we had 68 fencers represent Metro Tacoma Fencing Club competing in 485 individual events! We had three fencers compete internationally (Cristian, Benjamin, and Toby). We had 15 fencers compete nationally in 84 individual events and bring home 5 national medals. We had a division 2 men's foil national champion (Christopher). We had 7 fencers who earned national points and are thus nationally ranked (Gabey junior men's foil, cadet men's foil, Y14 men's foil; Christopher cadet men's foil, Y14 men's foil; Jackson junior men's foil, cadet men's foil; Cristian junior men's foil; Harrison Y14 men's foil; Toby veteran 50 men's épée, veteran 50 men's foil; and Teo Y14 men's épée). We had about 20 fencers earn or renew their ratings so far this year including an A2023 which is the highest classification (Andrew).

The president's award for the 2022-2023 season goes to Gabey who for the first time in Metro Tacoma Fencing Club history finished the season with over 3000 points. These in-house points calculated for our own fencers are calculated based on the number of opponents a fencer finished ahead of plus 1 for each event.
